# **HOUSING FAQS**

#### What's included in the room fee?

The University provides bath towels, bed linens, hangers, broadband Internet, and there is a daily towel exchange. You'll want to bring your own radio, alarm clock, hair dryer, iron, and mobile phone, as the only landline phones are in the hallways. Keeton House is air conditioned in the community rooms and dining room but not in the dorm rooms. Dorm rooms have a ceiling fan and a screened window that can be opened. If you are driving to Ithaca, you may want to consider bringing a portable fan.

#### When is check in/check out?

Thursday at noon/Sunday by noon.

#### Can I smoke in the dorms or bring my pet?

No and no (unless your pet is a service animal).

#### Can I get a room near my friends?

We can try! Room requests can be made by contacting your registration chair.

#### I have special needs—is it practical for me to stay in the dorms?

Yes! On the paper and online registration forms, there is a space to communicate your needs.

#### Does our class have a block of rooms at a hotel?

Yes. Call the Holiday Inn (607-272-1000) or the Hilton Garden Inn (607-277-8900) well before May 4 (when the block will be released) and tell them you're with the Cornell Class of '70. If you end up on the hotel waiting list, you should register for a dorm room in the interim and cancel by May 28 to get a refund.
